Protect yourself. Internet scams are all too common these days – don't jeopardize your security. Follow these simple guidelines to minimize your risk

Phishing is the use of fraudulent emails, copy-cat websites, or pop-ups to trick you into revealing personal information — such as account numbers, credit accounts, and social security numbers. **Legitimate companies don't ask for this information via email – don't supply it.** To make sure you're on the website you want, look at the URL to verify it's the correct one; beware of potentially confusing or misleading site identifications, such as subtle misspellings in the URL.

Report it — If you suspect you have received a phishing email, don't respond to it. You can report it by forwarding the e-mail to Homeland Security at phishing-report@us-cert.gov, or to the FTC at www.ftccomplaintassistant.gov if you think you've been a victim.

Beef up your security — Security software packages (with anti-virus, anti-spam, and spyware detection) are useful for those who engage in online financial transactions. Look for encryption via Secure Sockets Layer (SSL) technology, commonly shown by a closed padlock in the lower right corner of your screen. Do not click on links or attachments unless you trust the source.
